

## COVID-19 Testing Information for Maryland Veterans MDH Testing Task Force

This resource document is intended to provide current information to Maryland Veterans about COVID-19 testing, including where to obtain a COVID-19 test and other COVID-19 related resources.

## Who Should Get Tested?

The Maryland Department of Health (MDH) encourages the following individuals to get COVID-19 tests:

- Symptomatic individuals;
- All who suspect exposure, including those who are asymptomatic;
- Individuals who are at risk of exposure, including workers in frequent contact with the
  public in health care, emergency services, food and grocery, retail or manufacturing, public
  transportation, educational, and other congregate settings;
- Individuals who have been in large gatherings; and
- Individuals who have traveled recently, including those who have traveled to a state with a COVID-19 test positivity rate above ten percent or a case rate over 20 per 100,000.
